
Who are Oak Clinic Champions?

Oak Clinic Champions are volunteers throughout Northeast Ohio who are dedicated to those challenged by multiple sclerosis

We place our focus on helping MS patients in their own homes through group (project-based) volunteer efforts, allowing our patients and volunteers to interact, and learn and grow from one and other.

What is Multiple Sclerosis?

Multiple sclerosis is believed to be an auto-immune disorder of the central nervous system causing altered mobility, visual decline and loss of cognition, impaired mental well being, and financial and family challenges, among others.



MS patients lose 'nerve conductivity' because the myelin sheathing that protects the nerves becomes progressively or permanently damaged, or scarred (*sclerosis*), many (*multiple*) times when the body's immune system attacks itself.

The disease is progressive and over time the affected nerves stop working. There is no known cure for multiple sclerosis.

Who do we help?

- Mark was diagnosed with MS at the age of 22 in 2007...he lost his job and lives at home with his mother. Mark's mom is his caregiver; she also works a full-time job. There is little energy left for home improvements.
- Mary looks perfectly healthy. She will greet you and have a lengthy conversation with you. Mary has significant short-term memory impairment; she will never remember meeting you.
- Like many, Beth and Brad lived a two-income family of four lifestyle, needing both incomes just to make ends meet. Beth's MS forced her to stop working earlier this year and we have been able to help ease their financial crisis by providing assistance with Beth's medical costs, and some of the family's living expenses.
